The primary election is Tuesday, July 27. Early voting will be Friday, July 23, 8am - 6pm, Saturday, July 24, 8am - 1pm and Monday, July 26, 8am - 6pm. If a runoff is needed, it will be Tuesday, August 24. You must be registered to vote by July 30 to vote in the runoff and registered to vote by October 8 to vote in the general election, Tuesday, November 2.
